This contest is for the Logo that will be going on our documents, stationary, and other items pertaining to our Nation.

WHO CAN ENTER:

- 1. Citizens only.
- 2. All drawings no matter the age of the artist will be considered.

COMPETITION DETAILS:

- 1. Artwork may be hand-drawn or digitally produced.
- 2. Artwork must have a Gabrielino/Tongva cultural theme.
- 3. Artwork can be done in color or black and white.

SUBMISSIONS:

- 1. All artwork must be submitted with an entry form. DO NOT STAPLE the form to the artwork.
- 2. Sign your work on the backside of your drawing.
- 3. All artwork needs to be submitted on 8 1/2 x 11 inch white paper or smaller paper.
- 4. Please use an appropriate mailing envelope with a cardboard insert to keep your artwork from being bent.
- 5. All artwork must be received by October 15, 2012 to be considered.
- 6. Entry must have a written explanation to accompany the artwork. Please include this on the contest entry form provided.

CONTEST RULES:

- 1. Submitted artwork must be your original creation.
- 2. No tracing of others' artwork.
- 3. You may submit up to two entries per person (copy and include a separate form).
- 4. All artwork must visibly and legibly include the words GABRIELINO/TONGVA NATION LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA.
- 5. The artwork submitted cannot have already been published or produced in any medium and/or sold on any scale for retail or wholesale purposes.

Submission of artwork constitutes your agreement to the Logo Contest Terms & Conditions. Please read these over, as they describe your rights to the submitted artwork as well as ours.

SUGGESTIONS:

- 1. Traditional colors are black, red, and white. Secondary colors are yellow, blue, and green.
- 2. Use traditional animals pelicans, dolphins, sea turtles, tortoises, seals, deer, ravens, whales, orcas, flying fish, rattle snakes, hawks, bears, mountain lions, and spiders.
- 3. Use daily life items baskets, rattles, clap sticks, shells, and abalone conch shells
- 4. Use traditional plants California white sage, oak trees, acorns, elderberry, willows, and deer grass.
- 5. Use archeological findings petroglyphs, pictographs, carved beads, and cog stones.
- 6. Use traditional stories.

PRIZES:

- 3. Their artwork will be featured on all future documents, newsletters, stationary, tribal products, the website, and other items.
